



Dear parents/carers,

I am writing to give you some updates about our school survey and the parents' forum, our creative events this term and to ask you to reinforce some key aspects of behaviour expectations with your child/children.

Firstly we look forward to seeing you at the **parents' forum on Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> June at 7pm**. We will be seeking your views on the school's behaviour policy and updating you about how your children will be assessed next year. Refreshments will be available. A Turkish translator will be present.

The parents' forum has been very successful in enabling us to get your views. We want to hear even more from you about your views of our school and how we can improve it further. I would really like you to complete our parents' survey online. This is available on this link: <https://is.gd/ParentSNS2016>. The survey will take 5 to 10 minutes to complete. We will send you an update of our findings and responses by the end of this term. Please make your views count.

Secondly I want to remind you of some creative events at which we are showcasing our students' talents and great work. These are: the summer showcase on **Friday 1<sup>st</sup> July** – a showcase of all our creative subjects' work. **This is from 4pm-7.30pm**.

The drama production **We Will Rock You** is the following week **6/7/8<sup>th</sup> July**. To purchase tickets parents can use the ParentPay shop link on the website starting from Monday 13th June. The cost is £7 adults and £5 accompanied students. There are subsidised rates for families in receipt of income support.

Thirdly I want to thank you very much for your support for the school with reinforcing **behaviour expectations** – as in my previous letter. I want to congratulate the vast majority (two thirds) of our students who have no behaviour points.

Please could you also confirm to your child that the following are not allowed in school:

- Swearing: we do not expect our students to swear in the school building, playground or at any time while in school uniform. School staff will automatically issue behaviour points if they hear swearing. Swearing directed at any adult results in an exclusion from school.
- Touching: we do not expect our students to touch each other. We will warn students not to do this and any failure to comply will result in a behaviour point. The only exceptions to the touching rule are if a student is upset and needs comforting.
