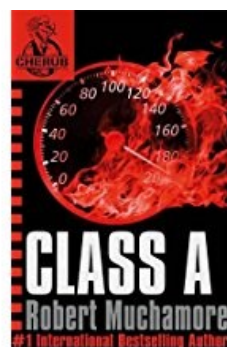
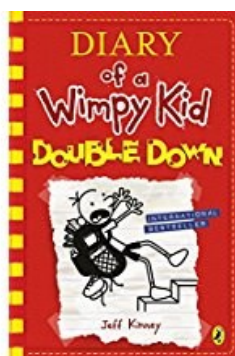

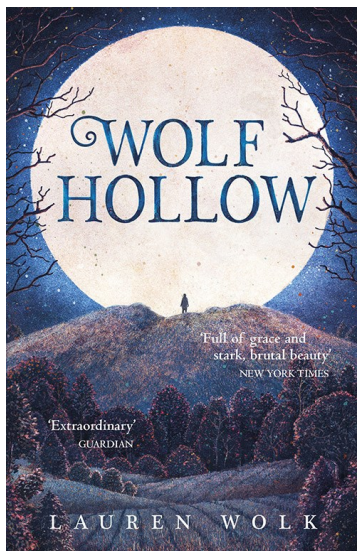
CILIP Carnegie Medal Shadowing in Hackney Schools

This year we are again taking part in Hackney School's Carnegie Medal Shadowing Scheme .

What is Shadowing?

Children and young people 'shadow' the judging process for the CILIP Carnegie and Kate Greenaway Children's Book Awards; they read, discuss and review the books on each shortlist selected by CILIP's panel of Librarian judges and engage in reading related activity online.

The student members of the Reading Club will be reading *Wolf Hollow* by Lauren Wolk. They will be adapting the book into a play to be presented live in front of all the Hackney secondary school in June.

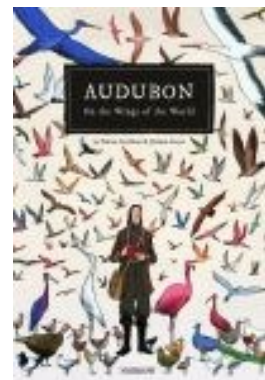
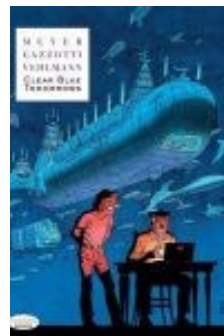
