




Bookbuzz 2018

















Carnegie Medal Winner

Student-Chosen Books


Miles Morales is taken out of the comics and given more dimension in his first novel.

How do you make a friend? When the school's resident genius musician Marie-Jose begins to be friendly with Victor he wonders what he can possibly give her... and how they can keep her secret.







Internationall y bestselling series about an assassin taking part in a tournament to win her freedom.




Series about a group of friends and how they show their unique personalities on their shared YouTube channel
